

1. The general planning for the development of the work throughout its whole territory;
2. The formulation of its own policy and programs within the scope of the Board's Charter and Manual which commit it to the establishing and maintaining of 'truly Biblical Missions;'
3. The assignment and supervision of the work of all individual missionaries;
4. Recommendations to the Board of advance work requiring the outlay of funds additional to those in use for the current year;
5. Recommendation to the Board of the number and qualifications of new missionaries needed for the fulfillment of the Missions responsibilities in the area assigned to it. Such recommendation should envision immediate and long range needs;
6. The initiative in suggesting needed institutions, agencies or special methods of work. These should include estimates of the cost of building and operating any agencies suggested;
7. The employment of native workers, in agreement with the Board's policy of native self-support;
8. Preparation of the budget to be submitted to the Board for the ensuing year's work; This budget should be in the hands of the Board not later than
9. Distribution of all undesignated funds made by the Board in the Missions budget, or of supplementary grants if such are made. Power of transfer also of "Board Funds" on the following conditions:
 - a. That each Mission will be responsible for bringing its expenditures for the year within its appropriations;
 - b. That if at the end of any year the Mission closes its accounts with a balance, this balance shall be reported to the Board's Treasurer and be applied toward the appropriation for the ensuing year;
10. The determination of all regular and emergency furloughs in accordance with the general regulations of the Board as to terms of service and furloughs;
11. The formulation of such rules and by-laws for the conduct of the Mission's business as seem to the Mission to be expedient;
12. Final determination of the Annual Report to be made to the Board.

Special Matters:

1. Appropriations:

The Board has established several classes of appropriations in which it feels that there must be priorities as noted below:

Class I. Salaries, children's allowances, rent, medical and similar expenses;

Class II. Travel to and from the field, including preliminary language study, outfit allowances, cost of passage and freight to the field;
