It is never the other way around. The dog, the elephant, the horse and the monkey never write books, establish libraries, or force men to do their will. Man is distinctly of a higher order. Man has something that the animals do not have--an eternal soul. This soul has needs of its own; it was made for eternity, not just for a brief time.

Unfortunately, man has turned away from the Creator who made him, and has brought sin and wickedness into this wonderful world that God has made. As a result, man's soul is headed for eternal darkness and misery, if man cannot find some way to escape from the sin that he has brought into the world. God, who provided so wonderfully for the necessities of earthly life, has also provided what is needed for the life of the soul. An even greater miracle than the miracle of providing earthly life was performed by God when He sent His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, to come to this earth and die on the cross of Calvary "that whosoever believeth on Him might not perish, but have eternal life."
