I would say this that anybody is affected to some extent by his preconceptions. but that an honest translater will do his best to de give what is there in relation to what is in— to the whole, of course. And I thing that we it is true that if a man has anti-Christian presuppositions and conceptions, they are bound to come in at some place. Jerome, but by the way, who translated the Latin Bible in 400 AD did an excellent job of it. His Bible was never authorized.

Damasous we urged him to make a translation but Damasxus was dead before the translation was fins—finished. It was never authorized and it was greatly opposed by many people but Jerome did a first class job, and his—translation—translation is an excellent translation, but the unfortunate thing is that the text of it has been very poorly preserved, has been altered in an—many places, and 400 years ago when the R.C. church or decided that the Vulgate of Jerome instead of the original should be the authoritation but the Church, then
