Marxism is a handy thing for propaganda. Whoever sees someone else better off than he is can be taught envy and then hatred by being told the other person is the oppressor and he is the oppressed, and, as Marx said, that he should rise up and destroy the oppressors. He is not informed that destruction of the oppressors will really mean putting himself even more completely in the hands of the party to treat him as it wills.

The Olympic games are supposed to be contests between amateurs in order to determine which nation's amateurs can win in the various sports. The entrants from communist nations are selected very early, as children, in order to be trained at length so as to advance the prestige of their nation. Throughout their lives they are trained and disciplined for the particular objective for which they have been designated, just as horses are trained to win races for their owners.

Aside from the very tiny ruling class in the so-called 'classless' society of Russia, most of the people would give almost anything in the world to be free American citizens instead of communist slaves. It is necessary for a communist country to brutally guard its borders, not to keep unwanted visitors out but to keep its own people in. They are kept as though they were the property of the central committee!

Many an American would like to forget the rest of the world. We should not do so. Our hearts should grieve deeply for those who are subject to communist tyranny. For our present purpose we shall leave that matter aside and ask the question: How does all this affect American liberties?

The answer is that the communist bosses will never be happy as long as any part of the world enjoys a better life in a different system. The ongoing massacre of the people of Afghanistan is sufficient evidence of the continuing
