produce a very special kind of revelation, a book in which he would.— He would give that which He would desire us to know, and would give it in a way as to get it into man's me-mind and consciousness and in a way that it could be preserved and read again, even when whole groups of people put Him out of their consciousness and try to forget Him.

Apart from such revelation from God, we have no way of knowing a great deal about Him. We see evidence of His power, evidence of His greatness, a evidence of His wisdom, but there are from God. It is just as you look at me and see what you can be tell before I give you a revelation. You can tell, as you look at me in my height, you can make a pretty of good guess of my weight, you can tell of my the color of my he hair, and skin. You might guess as to my phs- physical strength, but there are a great many things about to me that you could not possibly tell; simply by looking at me. One illustration of these, suppose suppose that you were to ak ask where I was born. You might look me over from top to bottom and examine me most minutely and unless I were to reveal it to you or someone else who knew were to reveal it to you, you would never guess that Calument, Michigan was the name of the town in which I was born.
