Gradually He gave them a perception of the new truths that He wanted them to understand. Once He said to them. I have many other things to tell you, but you cannot bear them now. However, when he, the spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth. ( Reference ) Here was a promise that after the disciples had known of the death and resurrection of Christ and were ready to realize more fully what it all meant they would be given very important truths that Jesus could not explain to Himself, because they were not yet ready to understand them. It is vital that these truths be contained in a book so that we also may know them and that we may have them in absolute accurate fashion. This promise which Jesus gave which is recorded in this verse in the book of John is a promise that we will have new truths that Jesus Himself did not explain which are very important for us to know. After the death of Jesus, the disciples began preaching the Word everywhere and the Holy Spirit was with them, leading and guiding them. The time came when the apostle Paul found it necessary to write back to the converts whom he had led to the Lord in Thessolonica to correct some misunderstandings that they had. Therefore, he wrote I Thessolonians, which is probably the first book of the Bible to be written. As time went on, Paul wrote other books to various churches where he had preached explaining the truths of the Gospel and of the Christian life to them more fully. Other ~~disciples~~ apostles such as Peter and John and other followers of the Lord such as James and Jude also wrote ~~XXX~~ letters to the Christian church. Paul wrote to his co-workers Timothy and Titus giving
