The most detailed report of Sennacherib's third ~~was~~ campaign is found in ~~found~~ columns two and three 2 and 3 of certain hexagonal prisms that the text of which differs very little from one another. They are: 1) The Taylor prism prism date 691 B.C., now in the British Museum. 2) The prism from 689 B.C. in the Oriental Institute of the University of Chicago (II 37 III 49). 3) A prism found in ~~1950~~ 1952 that ~~is~~ is ~~now~~ now in the museum in Ba gdad.

The first of these is translated in Gressman A T B, second 2nd edition 1926, p.352ff. The second is in the translated in Luckenbill, The Annals of Sennacherib, Oriental ~~Institute~~ Institute Publications Publications, Volume II 2 1924, and ANET page ~~px287ff~~ p.287f.

In the excavations at Nineveh there were also two small documents found relating to this campaign. Something found at Kouyunjik (nc ) has an inscription called I "the campaign of ~~Sennacherib~~ 701," and there was a text on ~~the~~ a stone ~~table~~ tablet found at Nebi Yunus relating to this ~~campaign~~ campaign (ANET page p.288).

On page ~~ix~~ 246 there are footnotes referring to an article by ~~ix~~ L. L. Honor Sennacherib's Invasion of Palestine published in New York in 1926, ~~px~~ p.19ff. pp.19ff. and one by R. W. Rogers, Sennacherib and Judah, a Beiheft Beihefte of ~~X~~ ZAW 27 (1914), p.322. There is also a reference to W.
