This book consists of messages given at the Jerusalem Conference on Biblical Prophecy in 1971. There are addresses by 22 men, varying considerably in their approach. It is always stimulating to meet with others who are vitally interested in a subject, and to listen to forceful presentations of some of its vital aspects, but in cold print much of the impressiveness of messages prepared for oral delivery may be lost. In addition, the reader who is seriously interested in learning something about prophecy is apt to find a book of this type rather discouraging, since the messages deal with such a variety of material and rarely enable one to investigate a subject in depth.

The conference was very different from most prophetic conferences that have been held in the past. These have usually consisted almost entirely of messages pointing to signs of the times and giving evidence that the return of Christ may be very near, and of messages dealing with specific details of major events connected with or following the Lord's return. Generally these have brought together speakers all of whom have agreed
