I would prefer to think he was thinking not only of the deuteronomic code but that the psalmist was referring to the whole of God's law. I do not see why the deuteronomic code should be in mide more than the material in Ex. 22: or the legal portions of Lev.

The wise son in Prov. 10:1 is of course not one particular wise son but we always use language like this. We may refer to an individual. WE may make an individual as typical of a group, or a type and this is a matter that has to be decided from context. If do not think it is write right to say that each one in the audience will color the meaning of the proverb according to his own experience", and that a parable such as the prodigal son is intended to have as many meanings interpretations as there are hearers." There is a definite meaning in the parable, which we can get with certianty One of us may draw a little more ffom it than another does. Beyond that there is great possibility of application but I believe we should separate application from interpretations as there are hearers" is valid.

I don't altogether agree with the statement on p. 45 about prophecy. I that do not think the fulfillment of the woman's seed would destryy the serpent
