We do not know, of course, how soon our Lord may come but if He tarries, it is certainly His will that we should be able to accomplish the utmost, not merely in one year, but over a long period of years while He tarries.

It was fine to hear the good news about Smock and Gordon. I trust the Lord will continue to bless all of you up there and to keep you close to Himself. May His blessing rest upon you in everything.
