SPIRITUAL BLINDNESS

Let us suppose that I were walking in the woods with an atheist, and we were to come upon a clearing which contained a little cabin, with smoke coming out of its chimney. Suppose that I were to say: "Isn't it strange what we see here? I wonder how it came into existence. There must have been a big wind that knocked over a number of trees, but it is remarkable that they should have happened to fall on top of each other, and to break off at just the same length so as to make the very even walls on the four sides of that cabin. It is even stranger that some of them should have broken into shorter lengths, and should have fallen in such a way as to have left spaces which provided for windows on three sides of the dabin. He would be entirely right in considering that I was talking nonsense. But it is equally nonsensical for him to talk as if this whole universe came into existence purely through the operation of blind chance. To think that the human eye with its marvellously complex features, including more than a million rods and cones, came into existence simply as a result of a purely natural and accidental process, with no mind back of it, is much more absurd than to think that the cabin came into existence simply by logs falling on top of each other after breaking off at just the right length, and that the windows and the stove were made and put in place by purely natural processes without any himan mind having been at work.

The Bible declares that the god of this world has blinded people's eyes, lest they should see the truth and should believe in Jesus Christ (2 Cor. 4:4). Surely there was never a greater instance of eyes being blinded than exists today, when so many of our educated people have been brainwashed into believing that there is no Divine ementality which has planned this universe, and which, after establishing it in accordance with a definite pattern, is still controlling in all that occurs.

It is sad indeed that during the past generation so large a portion of the educated classes of America have had instilled into their consciousness, denial of the existence and control of God.
