

16. 7<sup>th</sup> proof also from David, who expects such great things from the Lord, & yet declares the present life to be mere vanity.

17. 8<sup>th</sup> proof from common feeling & confession of all the pious who sought by faith & hope to obtain in heaven what they did not see in the present shadowy life

18. A continuation of the former proof from the emulation of the righteous, even amid the destruction of the world

19. 9<sup>th</sup> proof, Job who spoke most distinctly of this hope. Two obj. disposed of.

20. 10<sup>th</sup> from later Prophets, who taught that the happiness of the righteous was placed beyond the limits of the present life.

21. This clearly established by Elisha's vision of the dry bones, & a passage in Isaiah 26<sup>19-21</sup>.

22. Last proof from certain passages in the Prophets, which clearly show the future immortality of the righteous in the kingdom.

23. Concl. of whole discussion concerning the similarity of both dispensations. For fuller confirmation, & passage of script produced Acts 3<sup>26</sup> Matt 27<sup>52</sup> Acts 15<sup>8</sup> 2 Cor 3<sup>4</sup>, Refutation of error of Sadducees & other Jews, who denied eternal salvation & the sure hope of the church
