possibilities of some verses like this He that letteth will let, that seem to look very strongly in the direction of a Rapture some time before but which is somewhat questionable. It seems to me there are others which look somewhat in the direction of later but which are somewhat questionable, but these dozen passages I haven't seen a way to get around. It must be an extreme dispensational way of saying He is just talking to people later on. Now this particular passage here in Isaiah 26, the more I think of it the more it seems to me you have a clear reasonable interpretation. Here is the course of the age. Here is frustration at the end. And then here is resurrection and here is an exhortation, "Now, you will come with the Lord in heaven. You have the judgment seat of Christ. You have the marriage supper of the Lamb. At the same time the Lord comes out of His place on earth, punishes the wicked, and then you have the setting up of the Kingdom. Now, I may be entirely wrong on this. Six months ago I would have told you I didn't know what the Scripture teaches on this matter of the rapture. I was very, very uncertain. Perhaps I have become too dogmatic on it now. I hope not, but I think we have at least broken up the evidence and seen what the evidence is and I hope that we are all better fitted to go forward and study further into the matter than we were before. I think we've covered the I don't think there is anything that is clear, that is germane that we haven't at least touched on in the course and opened up, and I want to thank you who have come from a distance for coming and giving us your part in the discussion and your very stimulating suggestions and criticisms, and may the Lord bless each one of you and help us all to watch and serve the Lord truly during these days.
