- 3. Early Childhood (4-5)
 - a. Characteristics
 - (1) Physically he is a player (Esting, eleeping, playing make up his life)
 - (2) Flay is a physical trainer. (Retwoom e-os of 4 and 7 there is great emlargement of limbs so running is an important part of games. Play your stories, verses, songs.)
 - (3) Play is a sental instructor. Have good Rible story book with good, large pictures. Learn to share (yours and mine), teach truthfulness, some responsibility (put on and take off clothes, hang them up or put them may, pick up toys, etc.)
 - (a) Childish instincts expressed in play-work out through senses, learns self-control.
 - (b) Childish imaginations empressed in play. Thinks largely in mental pict wree-pictures developed in play, story-telling important.
 - (e) Childish imitations expressed in play-imitates real life experiences.
 - [1] Stimulates childish thinking
 - (a) Remembers

 Here proposity of child to imitate someone he admires
 may be utilized by parent or teacher to gain a purpose.
 - (4) Play is a social equalizar
 - (a) Wants to engage in games of others
 - (b) This checks spirit of egotion
 - (5) Play is a moral teacher
 - (a) Attitude of peers important to him
 - [1] By their attitude learns to avoid selfishness, stubbornness, tamtrums, tears, dishonesty, injustics.
 - (6) Heatally he is a questioner. (Why?)
 - (a) Encouragement or discouragement of child's questions will affect his aducation—question is index to his mind.
 - (b) Encouragement or discouragement of child's questions will affect his personality—question is also index to his personality himself—it is a manifestation of self-realization, self-seeking. This is time for developing personality.
 - (7) Raligiously he is a believer—believes everything you tell him because of lack of experience; therefore behooves parents and teachers to be scrupulously truthful.
