dependability of the Book of Daniel in this class, but to find what it means. It is important that we understand the relation of the three views, and that we understand what the holders of the 2nd view do in order to disprove the 1st view. That is, I would state it as a #general statement that it is much easier to hold either the 1st or the 3rd view than the second view I would say that if you find what the holders of the 2nd view do in order to combat the 1st view, you will find it pretty hard to stop at the 2nd view and not go on to the 3rd view. So it is excellent presentation, and excellent foundation for study of the 3rd view, to see the relation bewteen the 1st and the 2nd view, and how the 2nd deals with the 1st. So it is very important that we get that in mind. Now this much you might say has been introductory again to the general method, the general problem we have before us. I asked you today to study Daniel seven and Daniel 2. Yes?....AAM: ...second view. Both of them hold a very definitely evengelical view and believe that Daniel is true history, true prophecy, and entirely dependable, but I do not believe that their methods of inteppreting prophecy is a sound method. I don't believe so. Bat I believe that in order to deny the first view, they have to adopt principles which carry it on logically and must land us in the third view, not in the 2nd. Well, now, I asked you to xxxx study bh.2 for today, and I hope you all have in mind the principal events in ch.2.

Chapter Two is the first chapter inthe book that contains much prediction and it contains a great deal of prediction. It is probably the best known prediction in the **bask** book of Daniel. That is the best known lengthy prediction is chapter 2, among **prediction**. The brief statement, of **rest** course, that Christ makes that hereafter you will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds of heaven, that refers to ch.7, and that of course, is probably better known than ch.2 is, as a whole, because of its use in the gospels, but you will find that among Christians in **gram** general ch.2 is pretty well known and most of the last six chapters are not nearly as well known, at least not in any full way. But now this second chapter has, of course, that very interesting incident where the king had a dream and he forgot it, and
