king of Persia, I mean the same as the first year of Cyrus.... Well, regarding that a think all we can say is, we don't know. It is possible that Darius became the ruler of Babylon, of that area, under Cyrus, and that he reigned for a few years, and then when he died Cyrus did not appoint a ruler there as his successor, but simply took over direct control himself and sent a man who was simply called the governor, instead of the king, and so the Babylonians thought of it as the reign of Darius in their area, and then the reign of Cyrus. That is possible, It is equally possible, however, that they thought of it as the reign of Darius, who was the local ruler, and also in the reign of Cyrus, who conquered them, and the fact that the thrid year of Cyrus, it might be that Darius was there two years, and then that they simply thought of the rest as there was no man put in of equal power with Darius, and they simply thought of it as a continuation of Cyrus, and the third year of Cyrus, and you could refer back to the first year of Cyrus as the first year of Darius who was the man on the ground there.
