He says, you know, I've come to the conclusion that the Lord's will is that we should just go against all those things, take the place with the poorest salary, take the place with the least honor, take the place that in men's eyes is the smallest. He said never take a position of any power or importance. Well, this is taking the attitude and turning it to the other extreme, and it is not God's will I am quite^{convinced?} certain. It is far better than the attitude of feeling this is God's will when actually your eye is on the better salary, or your eye is on the more honor, or the higher position, or the nicest place to live. It is far better than that, but if (14)

God may want you to have of the best things of this world to use them for His glory, or He may want you to have the place with the least of the things of this world, because that is where you can serve Him best. It is not to pick one or the other but to be in the frame of mind in which these things are absolutely immaterial to you and you can say with Paul, I know how to abound and I know how to abase...
