Now one can be greatly used of God as an evangelist, and yet can utterly fail in that which is of utmost importance -- his own personal growth in grace. I doubt if anybody can grow in grace in any way that is effective in God's sight if he does not have an interest in evangelism, if he does not do what he can to win souls for Christ. But one can be a great evangelist because he is a wonderful speaker, and because he has a good ~~mat~~ mind that gathers things together and presents them in an effective way, and yet in his heart can be full of ~~wid~~ wickedness and one who will never receive God's approbation. Paul said, I keep my body under lest after I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway. He said in 1 Cor. 9:27.

If we're going to grow in grace we must be interested in producing the fruit in others of leading them to the Lord. But most important in God's sight is Are we ourselves, in the situations in which we find ourselves, with the particular qualities we have, are we developing the way God wants us to? That is tremendously important in His sight. The same is ^{helping} true of ^{helping} others to grow in grace. I was greatly impressed when I heard Dr. R.A. Torrey tell of an experience he had once. He said he talked ^a to/man and this man said to him, Torrey, You and I are the most effective workers in Christian
